Pulses prices may soften on improved supplies





Prices of pulses are likely to witness a softening trend in the new year with harvest of key varieties such as tur and urad and the imports including the yellow peas set to boost the domestic supplies. This is even as the chana crop for 2023-24 rabi season may see a decline of 10-15 per cent over the previous year's output mainly on drop in acreage, according to the trade.

Consumption of Arhar Dal down 15-20%

Synopsis

Consumers substituted tur dal with imported green lentils in homes in southern and eastern India, while in the northern and the western regions, tur dal was substituted with lentils in institutional consumption, said experts. Consumption of chana dal, which is being promoted by the central government as healthy alternative to tur dal, also increased in vegetarian meals, they said.



Consumption of tur or arhar dal has fallen 15-20% year-on-year in 2023 as retail prices have increased to ₹200 per kg from ₹130-140 per kg last year, said industry executives.

Harvesting Success: India's Lentil Bounty Blooms Amidst Favorable Conditions

India's lentil production is set to surge in the current crop year, with expectations of a 5-10% increase in yield, driven by excellent weather conditions in key states. Despite a slightly lower acreage, projections by the India Pulse and Grains Association point to a potential harvest of 16.5-17 lakh tonnes, signaling a robust agricultural season. Government initiatives, including a raised Minimum Support Price (MSP), further boost the sector, with authorities stockpiling 6.5 lakh tonnes. Although lentil imports have crossed a million tonnes, the market remains stable, offering a positive outlook for both farmers and consumers.

Highlights

Expected Increase in Lentil Production: Despite a slightly lower acreage compared to the previous year until mid-December, India's lentil (masur) production for the crop year (July 2023-June 2024) is expected to increase. Favourable weather conditions in key producing states like Madhya Pradesh and Uttar Pradesh are likely to result in higher yields.

Projections by India Pulse and Grains Association (IPGA): IPGA anticipates that the upcoming domestic masur crop could reach 16.5-17 lakh tonnes, surpassing the previous year's production of 15.5 lakh tonnes. The crucial period for plant growth and yield potential is seen in December-January, dependent on soil moisture availability.

Crop Conditions and Yield Expectations: Crop conditions in most growing areas are reported to be good. Manek Gupta, Managing Director of Viterra India Pvt Ltd, suggests that lentil yields may be higher, with a potential increase in crop by 5-10% compared to the previous year. The estimated acreage for the current year is around 18.5-19 lakh hectares.



India pigeon pea imports from top supplier Mozambique delayed, lifting prices

MUMBAI, Nov 8 (Reuters) - At least 150,000 metric tons of pigeon peas bound for India are held up at ports in Mozambique awaiting export permission from customs despite multiple requests from sellers over the past few weeks, five industry officials said on Wednesday.

The delay in shipments has pushed up prices of the protein-rich staple, known in India as arhar or tur, used to make daal curry in the peak-consumption festive season.

"Stocks are currently held in port-based warehouses and sellers are incurring huge storage and re-fumigation costs," said Suhas Chougule, managing director at MozGrain Lda, a local subsidiary of Ma'aden Saudi Arabia, based at Beira, Mozambique.


"Despite having all the necessary export documents per law, our 200 containers are stuck. The customs office in Mozambique is not granting permission nor are they giving any reason."

Govt may revoke Tur dal MoU with Mozambique

Synopsis

The Indian government is considering revoking the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Mozambique for importing 200,000 tonnes of tur dal due to irregularities and corruption issues within Mozambique. The supply of tur from Mozambique has been inconsistent, prompting the Indian Pulses and Grains Association to seek assistance from the Prime Minister's Office.



The government may revoke the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) that it had with Mozambique for import of 200,000 tonnes of tur dal, after the industry raised the issue with the Prime Minister's office.

"The supply of tur from Mozambique is not steady yet as they are grappling

with some corruption issues within their own country," said a senior official who did not want to be named.







Pulses Supply Shortage Expected to Persist Until Diwali

In the lead-up to the Diwali festival, India is poised to grapple with ongoing constraints in pulses supply, according to experts at a recent webinar organized by the Indian Pulses and Grains Association (IPGA). The situation has been exacerbated by multiple factors, including a lower-than-expected production of kharif moong, damage to urad crop quality due to September rainfall, and an anticipated shortage of 1 million tonnes of tur until new crops arrive in December/January.

Despite measures taken by the government to cap pulse prices, such as the recent reduction in stock holding limits for wholesale traders, the supply remains tight. Wholesale prices have witnessed a 2% to 4% decline following the 75% reduction in stock holding limits, but this move has also posed challenges for organized retailers like Reliance Retail in managing their inventories.

Dilip Mohanty, Senior VP of Reliance Retail, expressed their concerns, stating that their daily pulse requirement far exceeds the new stock limit of 50 tonnes. Organized retail chains with a substantial presence across the country are finding it difficult to operate within these restrictions and plan to approach the government with their concerns.

Transporting pulses from production centers concentrated in a few states to other parts of the country has become a daunting task for millers and processors. Nitin Kalantry, a pulses processor from Maharashtra, highlighted the logistics challenges, including the need to purchase different qualities of the same dai, often exceeding the truck capacity of 25-30 tonnes, which aligns with the new stock

Tur, chana prices fall 4% on rising imports, government actions, fall in demand

Synopsis

The prices of pulses in India have decreased by about 4% in the past month due to increased imports and reduced consumer demand. The price of tur/arhar dal has declined by 4% due to stock limits imposed by the government, while chana dal prices have also fallen by 4% as a result of increased supply and competitive tenders. However, industry executives believe that prices may increase during the festival season. In contrast, tomato prices have significantly dropped, with prices in wholesale markets ranging from Rs 3-6/kg.

Pune: Increased imports of arhar/tur from Africa and masoor from Canada, and the government's strict action on stock limits and aggressive selling of chana, along with reduced consumer demand amid high prices, have brought down prices of pulses by about 4% in one month.

No customs duty on Masur from US

Synopsis

India had announced it would remove retaliatory duties on certain US products, including masur, during Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit to the US in June. Customs duty of 22% on masur of US origin was made zero effective September 6. This will ease the import of masur directly from the US, instead of being routed via Canada.



India is trying to increase supplies through imports and by keeping close watch on domestic stockpiles amid shortages of different pulses due to lower production in the previous year.

The government, which is looking to step up the supply of pulses from all possible sources, has abolished customs duty on US-origin masur a day before the arrival of US President Joe Biden for the G20 summit.

The government has also made it mandatory for local stocks of masur to be reported weekly to quell attempts at cartelisation and manipulation aimed

at restricting supplies.

India's imports of lentils (masur) are set to rise this year on higher consumption as the production of other key pulses such as tur, moong and urad is seen lower on erratic weather. Based on the current import trend, the trade estimates India's lentils purchases would rise by over a million tonnes this financial year over previous year's 8.58 lakh tonnes.

"Masur imports from April till now have already crossed half a million tonne mark. Another 1.5-2 lt are on the way. We expect the masur imports to cross over a million tonnes this financial year," said Bimal Kothari, Chairman, India Pulses and Grains Association (IPGA) the apex trade body.

India's production of lentils during 2022-23 stood at over 15.8 lt, per third advance estimates released in May, higher than previous year's 12.69 lt. Lentil imports, which touched a high of 11.16 lt in 2020-21, had dropped to 6.67 lt during 2021-22 and are seen rebounding.

Pulses supplies to remain constrained till Diwali

Synopsis

There is likely to be a shortage of 1 million tonnes of tur till the harvest of new crops begins in December/January, while the production of kharif moong is expected to be lower by 12%. The quality of urad crop under harvest has been damaged due to rainfall in September.



Government measures could cap the price rise of **pulses** though trade and industry experts expect the supply situation to remain tight till **Diwali**. The 75% reduction in **stock holding limit** for wholesale traders announced on Tuesday has seen wholesale prices falling 2% to 4%. However, it has also made it tough for the organised

retailers like Reliance Retail to manage their inventories.

Australia, Brazil to grow Arhar dal for India consumers

Synopsis

Satish Upadhyay, executive committee member, IPCA, said, "Australia had earlier done trial production in 2019 and the quality was good. However, it could not go ahead as the prices in India were not remunerative for them. Now they have again started work to grow pigeon pea for the Indian market." The sources, however, said that for the initiative to succeed, the Australian counterparts may like to get assured orders from the Indian government.



Ahmedabad, June 30 (IANS) Gujarat is impacted by the pulses price surge. According to the latest market rates, the average wholesale price of arhar (tur/red gram) in Gujarat stands at Rs 8,335 per quintal (as on Friday). The retail price is even higher, reaching Rs 169 per kg.

Farmers in Australia and Brazil are set to experiment with growing arhar (pigeon peas) for consumers in India, where demand for the popular yellow lentil--the main ingredient of 'dal tadka' and 'sambhar'--has been outpacing domestic production for some years now.






Trade association of neighbouring nation denies hoarding, assures to augment supplies
